CST seeks to protect Britain's diverse and vibrant Jewish community from the external threats of bigotry, anti-Semitism and terrorism. CST provides physical security, training and advice for the protection of British Jews.

CST provides training and advice to the Jewish community as well as providing valuable information and advice to other faith communities, police, government and media.

As part of CST's strategic plan which provides a clear direction for all its activities, the focus is to raise awareness around the issues of anti-Semitism and terrorism.

We publish an incident report annually which helps us to measure the number of anti-Semitic incidents and clarify where our training and support should be directed. This helps us to discuss with the police and government what support is required.
